Underraga Terroir Hunter Pinot Noir 2013

The 2013 T.H. Pinot Noir Leyda was produced with fruit from a 2.97-hectare plot of vines planted 14 kilometers from the Pacific Ocean on clay and granite soils. It fermented with indigenous yeasts in stainless steel and matured in French barriques (12% of them new) for ten months. Some whole clusters were used (as they've done since 2010) in trying to look for some more complexity, a wine marked by the granite and the sun (the light) from Leyda. There are notes of ripe red berries and a spicy touch. The palate is medium-bodied, with ripe flavors but a more austere texture, approachable and tasty. 31,200 bottles produced.
